CRITICAL THINKING/ PROBLEM SOLVING

- ♥ Uses problem solving and negotiation skills during disagreements and conflict
- ♥ Likes to work on long-term projects

CREATIVITY/INNOVATION

- ♥ Demonstrate imagination and curiosity
- ♥ Expresses interest in the cultural traditions and artistic efforts of others

COMMUNICATION/COLLABORATION

- ♥ Expresses thoughts and ideas using oral, written, or nonverbal communication
- ♥ Use communication for a range of purposes

LEADERSHIP/RESPONSIBILITY

- ♥ Volunteers to take on jobs and responsibilities; follows through with tasks related to responsibilities
- ♥ Seeks out adults as role models, confidants, and sources of guidance, support, and encouragement

HEALTH/WELLNESS

- ♥ Exhibits increasing physical coordination
- ♥ Chooses nutritious foods to support a healthy lifestyle

SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL

- ♥ Uses mistakes as a learning tool, is not discouraged by mistakes
- ♥ Expresses emerging sense of self through music, drama, dance, writing and personal style

Since 1968 Program Directors, Center Coordinators, Curriculum Specialists, and Teachers collaborate to develop age specific curriculum. Our program is based on current and proven research, knowledge and practices in Early Care and Education.

The Ebenezer program we call E.P.I.C. is a curriculum designed to enable children to develop knowledge, skills, and processes and then apply them to the real world.

E.P.I.C. focuses on the development of the whole child both as an individual and as a member of a larger community. We believe children learn best in a play-based environment where they can explore, interact and create based on their own interests and abilities.

E.P.I.C helps children develop a sense of competence, confidence and positive feelings about learning in order to establish a base line for life long learning.

- ♥ Incorporate Virtue language and role model virtues
- ♥ Schedule indoor and outdoor activities to develop large muscle skills and coordination
